+ Driveline Assistant & Crossing Guard Volunteer

The Driveline Assistant & Crossing Guard Volunteer ensures the efficient, safe, and organized flow of car and pedestrian traffic during student drop-off and pick-up times. This volunteer plays a crucial role in assisting students and parents as they navigate the carpool process.

This role is ideal for AXIS family and community members who are organized, safety-conscious, and eager to help make school drop-off and pick-up times run smoothly for students and families.

+ Responsibilities

- Coordinate Traffic Flow: Direct cars and parents through designated drop-off and pick-up areas to maintain a smooth and efficient traffic flow.
- Safety Oversight: Ensure students are safely escorted to and from their vehicles, helping them in and out of cars as necessary, and ensuring they enter and exit vehicles at the appropriate locations.
- Enforce Cross Guard Safety Rules: Remind drivers and students of safety guidelines, including appropriate speed limits, drop-off procedures, and proper seatbelt use.
- Problem-Solve and Address Issues: Work with school staff to resolve any issues that arise during driveline or drop off, such as late arrivals, traffic delays, or safety concerns.

Volunteer Environment	Volunteers in this role will be working in the AXIS parking lot and entryway. This role requires mobility and the ability to enforce traffic and pedestrian safety regulations. The ability to stand and walk for half an hour is required.
